Our Lawrence University Alumni Tour of the Imperial Cities of Central Europe will begin in Prague, known as the "City of a Hundred Spires" and the largest city in the Czech Republic. Prague is a magical city, known for its well-preserved medieval architecture and rich cultural and political life. Our group will see the gothic-style St. Vitus Cathedral, tour the Old Jewish Quarter, and take in the dramatic Charles River. We will also reflect on the life and times of our own Professor Mojmir Povolny, who was born in what is now the Czech Republic just over 100 years ago, and whose early political career began in Prague.

From Prague, our tour will travel through scenic countryside to Vienna, once the capital of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. In addition to taking in its gothic and barogue architecture, we will have the opportunity to sip coffee outdoors in a street cafe, take lessons in the Viennese waltz, listen to a Mozart concert, and cruise down the Danube to Melk Abbey. We'll also reflect on Austria's changing political role from a dynastic center, to a contested country in World War Two, to a neutral country in the Cold War, to its present position as a full member of the European Union.

After an afternoon stop in Bratislava, Slovakia, our tour group will arrive in Budapest, Hungary to soak in its life and culture, from medieval times to the present. We'll learn about Hungary's historic achievements in the arts and culture, as well as life during the Cold War under communist rule and in contemporary Hungary.

Our group will be limited to no more than 20, giving us an intimate look at these countries and their cultures from the inside.

Stacy Mara and I look forward you to joining us in Prague, Vienna, and Budapest.

Imperial Cities Host Bio: Claudena Skran

Edwin & Ruth West Professor of Economics and Social Science and Professor of Government Coordinator, Povolny Lectures Series in International Studies

A member of the Lawrence faculty since 1990, Claudena Skran is a scholar of international affairs, whose research focuses on the role of international organizations in providing emergency relief and the resettlement of refugees. In 2005, she was awarded a U.S. Fulbright Scholars grant and spent six months in Sierra Leone

studying the role of NGOs in refugee resettlement following the country's 10-year-long civil war, Since coming to Lawrence, Skran has led students on trips to the West African nation. She founded her own NGO – Kids Give – a scholarship program that today is financially supporting students at three different schools in Sierra Leone. She is the author of Refugees in Interwar Europe: The Emergence of a Regime. After earning her bachelor's degree from Michigan State University, she earned master's and doctorate degrees from Oxford University, which she attended as a Rhodes Scholar.







Spain's Classics and Portugal Host Bio: Rosa Tapia

Professor of Spanish, Global Studies, and Film Studies

A native of Spain and member of the Lawrence faculty since 2002, Rosa Tapia is a scholar of Spanish and Latin American literature and film. Her research takes her frequently to Spain and Latin America, as it focuses on the representation of historical memory and national identity in the wake of civil conflicts and democratic transitions. Publications include the book Catalan Writers on the Border, a volume on Latin American



cinema, and a number of articles on Spanish literature and Latin American film. Tapia's research is deeply connected to her classes, where students engage with authentic materials and current cultural topics in preparation for studying and living abroad. She has received several teaching awards, including Lawrence's junior faculty award in 2005, as well as the award for excellence in advising in 2014. Tapia chairs the national development committee for the AP Spanish exam and she organizes the Lawrence University Latin American and Spanish Film Festival. After earning her bachelor's degree from the Universidad de Granada in Spain, she earned a master's degree from the University of Delaware and a doctorate from Penn State University before coming to Lawrence.

Day 1: Overnight Flight

Set out on a grand cultural adventure through the Imperial Cities of Central Europe – Prague, Vienna and Budapest. Along the way, enjoy traditional entertainment, local cuisine, and a glimpse into this region's eminent history.

Day 2: Prague, Czech Republic - Tour Begins

Arrive in Prague, the "City of 100 Spires." Behold ancient landmarks and medieval architecture. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. (D)

Day 3: Prague

Feel the magic and wonder of Prague. Your introduction to this fairy-tale city begins with a panoramic tour. Discover Prague on your own. Consider shopping for Bohemian crystal or visiting the city's museums, such as the Lapidarium. Maybe you will join an optional excursion to Prague's Old Jewish Quarter to see its historic Jewish Museum and Europe's oldest Jewish cemetery, founded in 1478. Personalize your evening with Diner's Choice, choosing from a selection of different venues. Perhaps you'll enjoy traditional cuisine at a folklore show, or discover the city through its craft beer and food scene, or opt for a more quiet dinner at the hotel. (B, D)

Day 5: Prague - Cesky Krumlov - Vienna, Austria

Travel through the scenic countryside on your way to Vienna. En route, make a stop in the medieval town of Cesky Krumlov. Lined with towering Baroque architecture, explore the quaint preserved streets before continuing on to the grand city of Vienna. (B)

Day 6: Vienna

Join a local guide at the magnificent Schonbrunn Palace, the summer retreat of the Habsburg dynasty for more than 200 years. Continue on to Vienna's city center and behold the beautiful architecture, scenic parks, and gothic spires that fill the city. Enjoy an afternoon at leisure where perhaps you'll partake in the city's famous cafe culture as you walk the streets, watching locals take a moment out of their day for a hot coffee and bite of cake. Tonight, hear Vienna's past come alive and experience a classical performance featuring the works of Mozart and Strauss. (B, D)

Day 7: Vienna 😵

Choose how you spend your day because **it's your choice!** Venture down the Danube to the medieval town of Durnstein and cruise to the 11th-century Melk Abbey **-OR-** join a local guide in the Belvedere Museum, home to Gustav Klimt's iconic painting *The Kiss* **-OR**enjoy a leisurely morning before attending a Viennese Waltz lesson in the afternoon. The rest of the day is yours. (B)

Day 8: Vienna - Bratislava, Slovakia -Budapest, Hungary

Say hello to Bratislava, the former Imperial capital of the Habsburg Empire. Get to know the city's 4,000-year-old history on a tour with a local expert. Connect with the villagers of Dunaalmas during a community-hosted lunch, learning how to make traditional strudel. Arrive in Budapest, the "Queen of the Danube" and your home for the next 3 nights. Chat with a local and hear stories about his life in the former communist area. Enjoy the evening on your own. (B, L)

Day 9: Budapest

Day 1: San Jose, Costa Rica - Tour Begins *Pura vida*. In English, it translates to "the simple life." But *pura vida* is so much more: it's an attitude; a celebration of life in the moment. It's time to experience what *pura vida* means to you. You're on your way to explore a place that's unlike anywhere else in the world, where *pura vida* is an unofficial motto and a way of life.

Day 2: San Jose - Tortuguero National Park Welcome to Tortuguero National Park. Travel by boat to your hotel before heading further down the rivers and canals to the world's first sea turtle research station. Next, a local will teach you all about his village and its previous history as a coconut plantation. Watch as he demonstrates how they use coconuts before trying your hand at making a local favorite: coconut candy. Later, have time to explore Tortuguero town with your Tour Manager. Relax at your lodge set in the middle of the jungle, your home for the next two nights. From the morning calls of the monkeys to the gentle chatter of the birds, listen to the active sounds of the rainforest around you. (B, L, D)

Day 3: Tortuguero National Park Begin the day on an excursion to search for the elusive green macaw and other unique winged creatures that flock to Tortuguero. Embark on a nature cruise, getting a glimpse into the life of jaguars, manatees, ocelots, and more. The rest of the day is yours to enjoy your Tortuguero resort. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Tortuguero National Park - Sarapiqui - San

Carlos Take a boat back to the mainland and make your way towards Sarapiqui and Tirimbina Rainforest Center. Spend time at a cacao plantation and see the process of converting the seed from bean to bar, tasting for yourself why cacao is called "the food of the gods." Later, arrive at your secluded nature resort, nestled on the edge of the San Carlos River. Stroll the butterfly and botanical gardens. (B, L, D)

Day 5: San Carlos Explore the beauty of your surroundings on a Penas Blancas River Safari. Float down the river on a peaceful adventure, taking in the sights and sounds of the rainforest as your naturalist guide describes the wildlife around you. Visit the *finca* of a local family and try specialty snacks such as banana bread, gourmet Costa Rican coffee and more. End your day with a guided walk through a private, primary forest reserve for a look at the various flora

and fauna. (B, D)

Day 6: San Carlos - Hanging Bridges -

Arenal Today, suspended over the rainforest floor, relish a bird's-eye view of the jungle on a guided tour of Arenal's famous hanging bridges. High above the jungle canopies, marvel at a cloud forest around you. Settle into your resort surrounded by striking views of Arenal's famous volcano for the next 3 nights. (B, D)

Day 7: Arenal 😵 Today, it's your choice!

Glide over the canopies on a mind-blowing zip line through the jungle **-OR-** make your way across lava fields for an up-close-and-personal look at the volcano on a moderate hike along the trails formed by lava during the 1968 eruption. The afternoon is yours. Or, consider an optional excursion to a family-owned *finca* with an included farm to table lunch. (B, D)

Day 8: Arenal In the shadow of Arenal Volcano, the day is yours to enjoy at leisure. Perhaps you will opt to immerse yourself in wildlife as you float along a river on the Cano Negro Wildlife Refuge cruise, or, if you're feeling adventurous, opt for an exhilarating white water rafting experience. Your day ends in Madrid, Spain's lively capital and largest city. (B)

Day 10: Madrid During a locally guided panoramic tour of Madrid's historic center, see iconic sites such as the Puerta del Sol and Plaza Mayor. Join a local expert to explore the priceless masterpieces of the Prado Museum, which boasts some of the world's finest collections of art by masters such as Velazquez and Goya. Your afternoon is free to explore. (B, D)

Day 11: Madrid - Toledo - Elvas, Portugal Travel to Toledo and embark on a city tour, highlighting the magnificent Gothic cathedral. Then, it's your choice! Visit the Church of Santo Tome and view El Greco's masterpiece painting, The Burial of Count Orgaz -ORexplore the Santa Maria la Blanca museum, located in a former synagogue and recognized as the oldest synagogue building in Europe.
